He was the sole proprietor of the company Kane Konstruction from 1959-1989. He built many homes in the Holland and South Haven areas. Al and Lois were founding members of the First Presbyterian Church. Their third child was the first child to be baptized there. Al was also a Scoutmaster for many years. In 1961 he was given the "Silver Beaver" award for distinguished service.
