



Amy Jo DeKruyter

May 15, 1970 - December 20, 2022

Heaven welcomed Amy Jo DeKruyter, age 52, of Holland, MI, into her eternal home on Tuesday, December 20, 2022. A beautiful mother, wife, sister, and daughter, she died after a year-long journey with multiforme glioblastoma. Amy's unforgettable smile, sparkling eyes, listening ear, and warm welcome marked a life of love, service, and deep Christian faith. Born in 1970, she attended Zeeland Public Schools, traveling to Bolivia in her senior year of high school as a Rotary exchange student. After a double major in Spanish and Psychology/Sociology at Hope College ('92), she earned a Masters in Social Work at Western Michigan University ('95). These early interests in other cultures, languages, and peoples, and in working to enrich the lives of others, can be traced across Amy's life. Her love for teaching was seen in her years as a substitute teacher—often in Spanish—at Borculo Christian, Zeeland Christian, and Zeeland Public Schools, giving piano lessons, leading Community Bible Study groups, and teaching children's worship at church. She also worked and volunteered for many years at South Olive Christian School. Teaching was often combined with Amy's passion for community service. She was a Crop Walk coordinator for more than ten years and taught classes on canning and pie-making through Zeeland Recreation. Church stood at the center of Amy's life. She worked for the Reformed Church in America as Coordinator for Volunteer Services ('96-'06), served on the boards of Western Theological Seminary and Camp Geneva, and continually volunteered at North Holland Reformed Church, whether coordinating

Christmas programs, organizing youth group hayrides, or making pies for the Ottawa County Fair.

Amy loved many outdoor activities, such as running, biking, ice skating, downhill skiing, hiking, camping, and gardening. She found joy in picking fruit, pie-making, canning, and making maple syrup, activities that she loved to share with others. Her competitive spirit could surface in almost any domain, whether running, playing games with family, or collecting junior ranger badges at national parks. Amy's life revolved around her family infused with her love of God. She was a beautiful, supporting wife to her husband and lovingly devoted to her three children.

Amy is survived by her husband, David DeKruyter; children: Ana, Peter, and Jack; parents, Robert and Nancy Haveman; parents-in-law, Gordon and Joyce DeKruyter; siblings: Jody and Dan Machiela, Ron and Beth Haveman, Tracy and Daniel Smith; in-laws: Tim and Julie DeKruyter, Doug and Deb DeKruyter, Brad and Linda DeKruyter; as well as many nieces, nephews, and cherished friends.

Visitation will be from 1-4pm and 6-8pm on Wednesday, December 28, 2022 at North Holland Reformed Church, 12050 New Holland St., Holland, MI 49424. Funeral services will be at 11:00am on Thursday, December 29, also at the same location. The service will be recorded and posted on the Facebook page of North Holland Reformed Church. 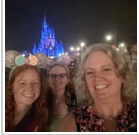

There was never a time I spent with her- even in December- that she couldn’t figure out a way to get across what she wanted to say or ask. It might take time - but her strong determined spirit remained. And when it was time to go, every single time - she would look at my eyes and say to me before I left “Love you Niki Heil. Good mom. Good job.” In the midst of her earthly body preparing for heaven, she was still working to pour love and service to others. Oh Amy - I love you too. You are a good mom and you, my friend, did a good job. I can only imagine the Joy when you saw

Him face to face. My heart shatters for your family. The loss of you here is immense and far too soon. We all await that day to be with you singing again - knowing you will be part of the welcome and hospitality team in heaven greeting everyone from "all around the world" ♡♡
