“Oh the memories I have of Clarence! I also worked at FMB and got to know Clarence well. I was a 25-year-old kid working as a computer operator on the evening shift. Clarence often walked through the bank late in the evening just to check on things, much like a night watchman. Clarence enjoyed scaring the daylights out of me with an alarm bell. On the wall just outside the computer room was a manual switch for an alarm and the bell was right behind me inside the computer room. Clarence would stand in the darkened hall and watch me through the windows, then flip that switch and laugh when I jumped out of my skin. Then we'd talk for a while and he'd tell me hunting stories rabbit hunting, coon hunting, bear hunting in the U.P.

Some times I'd be in the basement grinding up obsolete computer printouts and I'd see Clarence down there and we'd talk for a while. He'd tell me hunting stories rabbit hunting, coon hunting..... Yes, lots of fond memories of Clarence at the bank.

Larry and Jerry mounted two birds for me in the mid 1960's. I think I paid \$20 for one and \$24 for the other a year later. That was money well spent because both of those birds look great yet today, 45+ years later.
