Cornelius "Conn" Witt, age 84, of Holland, entered into his heavenly home on Thursday, December 14, 2017. Conn grew up in the Holland area, and served in the Army during the Korean War. After graduating from Calvin College, he moved to Ripon, CA. He taught English at Ripon Christian High School, Chicago Christian High and Manteca Unified. Conn returned to Holland in 2013. He enjoyed singing and was part of the Golden Valley Barbershop Chorus for 15 years while in California.
