David J. Mulligan, age 71, of Holland, died of complications of non-Hodgkin lymphoma and myelodysplastic syndrome on Saturday, July 27, 2024. He was born in Hastings, Michigan and raised in Middleville, Michigan.

“ I first met Dave in 1983, when he joined our radiology practice in Holland, MI I had finished training and joined the group only one year earlier, so Dave and I quickly became good friends and colleagues. We had much in common: similar age, recent training, newest and youngest members of Grand Valley Radiology, and faithful Catholics. Over the next 41 years, my wife Jodi and I enjoyed a close relationship with Dave.

As another friend of Dave's has said in her comments here, Dave predictably did not mention any of his accomplishments in his obituary, so I will take the liberty of doing that for him! Dave was an outstanding radiologist, both diagnostically and in performing interventional procedures such as arteriograms and myelograms. His brilliant and inquisitive mind made him one of my first choices when requesting a 2nd opinion about a case I was reading or a procedure I was performing. His kindness and thoughtfulness made such encounters all the more pleasant and affirming.

Most importantly, Dave valued his faith. As his illness progressed and treatment options were exhausted, it was clear that his faith, including frequent attendance at Mass and reception of sacraments, was his greatest source of strength and consolation. When Dave was no longer able to travel to church, we and others were blessed to bring him Holy Communion, which he greatly desired. That also provided us with an opportunity for visits with him once or twice per week in recent months. During those special times, we observed the grace and strength with which he bore his prolonged and debilitating illnesses. As others have noted, Dave accepted his limitations with a very positive and grateful attitude, always quick to point out all that he had to be thankful for. Even in the last 1-2 weeks of life, he told me that he still loved to read, had a good appetite, and was looking forward to watching the Olympics! I was with him a couple of days before he passed on to new life. I am thankful for that because, sadly, we were on our way to California for our son's wedding when Dave died and were unable to attend the funeral.)
