David Ostrowski Sr., 73, of West Olive, passed away peacefully on Sunday, April 16, 2017. David was born March 2, 1944, in Brisbane, Australia, to Francis "Frank" and Stella (Keable) Ostrowski. He graduated high school and was attending college when he was drafted into the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. In 1966, he married Marilyn Faust. He rose quickly through Army ranks at Fort Knox and was sent to serve in Vietnam. He was awarded the bronze star medal for valor. After the war he worked in automobile businesses.
