His greatest joy was seeing his family all together. He diligently had morning devotions with mom, enveloping the family in prayer. He cherished our Christmas tradition of passing the candle, with each one saying what they were most thankful for that year. Ed graduated from Holland Christian High School in 1953 and married the love of his life, his "Ruthie" in 1955 and together they had four children. He worked for 43 years as a chemical supervisor and in human resources at Parke-Davis (Warner Lambert). He had an amazing green thumb and grew his own flowers in his greenhouse for over 50 years. His yard was meticulous and even won the Holland Bloomin' Best Front Yard contest one year. He loved to sing and was in many ensembles over the years including the Magnachords, His Men, the Helmsmen Quartet, and Evergreen Chorale. He also sang with church choirs and served as both elder and deacon through the years. He was a member of Central Wesleyan church. Ed served honorably in the Michigan National Guard with one of his calls to duty being the 1956 F5 tornado that ravaged West Michigan. Ed

enjoyed golfing, including two holes in one. He was born June 9, 1935 to Alice (Sjoerdsma) and Edward Slenk Sr. He was preceded in death by his parents, granddaughter Leah Slenk, and siblings Carolyn Raterink and Alan Slenk.
