He was born in Holland to Carl and Della Visscher, was a life-long resident of Holland, and attended Holland schools, Hope College, and Northwestern University. He had a long career in the financial industry, coming to First Michigan Bank in 1968 and remaining there for the rest of his career, and retiring in 1994. He began at FMB in the Trust department in Zeeland and retired as President of FMB Financial group.

Henry was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Holland, the Zeeland Rotary Club, a long-time member of the Holland Country Club serving as President of the Board of Directors, Holland Elks Club, and the

American Legion. He was active in assisting in the Annual Fund Drive for Hope College.

Henry loved golf and tennis, and he captured the first state tennis title for Holland in the boys 15 and under tournament in 1952. He played into adulthood.

Henry was preceded in death by his parents; his three sisters: Carla Wierda, Donna Holly, Judy Engle; and brother, Mike Visscher. 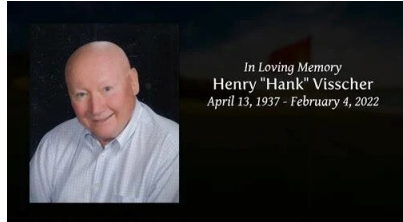
