James Morrison Watt, 97, died peacefully at his home on Tuesday, March 29.

Jim was born October 7, 1918, in Chicago, Illinois to Lynn and Ethel Morrison Watt and grew up near St. Louis, Missouri. After graduating from Oberlin College he moved to Zeeland to work for Zeeland Chemical for over 40 years, through many ownership changes. In 1942 Jim married his college sweetheart, Jean Sauer. He was a devoted husband, dad and grandpa and an active community leader, including serving as church treasurer, deacon and elder and a member of the Community Foundation of the Holland/Zeeland Area. He was an avid photographer and enjoyed carpentry, correspondence, music, travel and sports. He will be greatly missed by his family, his dedicated caregivers and his many friends.
