He graduated from Zeeland High School and Davenport College. John served in the U.S. Navy from 1952-1954 and in 1955 he joined Northwestern Mutual Financial Network where he had a very successful career both as a financial agent and as a financial representative and advisor. In 1970-1971 he was President of the District Agents Association and in 1986 he served as President for the General Agents Association. He was a member of the Davenport College Foundation Board of Trustees and in 1991 John was presented the Distinguished Alumni Award. He was also for many years the Treasurer and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Words of Hope, the radio broadcasting arm of the Reformed Church. John was also a man of faith, who

was very supportive at Christ Memorial Church in Holland. A special thank you to all the staff at Freedom Village who lovingly and compassionately cared for John and his family for the six and a half years he lived there.
