



## Joyce Plewes

November 19, 1918 - May 5, 2015

Joyce (Wicht) Plewes was born on November 19, 1918, in Minneapolis, Mn. When she was 4 years old her family moved to the Grand Rapids area. Following her High school graduation Joyce attended Davenport College, while there, she met the love of her life Lloyd Plewes of Zeeland. When they married in 1940, they moved to Zeeland, Mi. where they raised their 5 children and were very active in the Community. Joyce, was a member of Second Reformed Church since 1940, and served for many years as the Church Secretary. She worked for the Ottawa County Extension Service and also worked many years at Hope College in the Geology Dept. where she retired after 26 years. She loved working with the Hope students and hosted many of them in her home, especially those from foreign countries, for holidays and weekends when the school closed and they could not travel home. Her home was always open to friends and family, as she loved to cook and share great conversations around her dining table. Joyce was known for her quick wit, a kind and caring love for her family and friends, a wonderful mind that was always searching for new ideas through reading books, writing poems, and playing in a bridge group several times per week. Lloyd and Joyce shared a love for dancing to Big Band music, for the many who cleared the floor to watch them dance together, all would agree that they had mastered that art! She was a gracious hostess in her home and a faithful supporter in each of her children and grandchildren's lives. She was a Boy Scout Troop leader, a member of the Zeeland Women's Literary Club, Zeeland Historical Society,

Zeeland Hospital Guild, and many book clubs. In her later years, with declining eye sight, she loved to daily listen to her books on tape. Joyce was preceded in death by her husband, Lloyd in 1994, parents, Fred and Rose Wicht, her 2 brothers, Fred and Robert, Mother in law, Della Kate Plewes, Son in law, Aubrey F. Mills, Grandson, Scott A. Plewes and Great Grandson, Zachary A. Kraai.
