



## Leon P. Witteveen

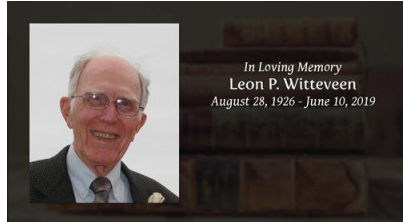
August 28, 1926 - June 10, 2019
