Robert Hinkley, 75, of Holland, formerly of Vicksburg, Michigan, passed away September 7, 2015. Bob was born May 17, 1940, in Kalamazoo, Michigan, to Genevieve (Munn) and Merle Hinkley. He married his beloved wife, Karen, in 1978. Together, they enjoyed art, music, camping and travel. He was preceded in death by his wife, Karen, in January, 2015, and his parents. Bob worked as a tool and die maker, creating toys for Kenner and other interesting projects. His interests in life were as well-rounded as the wheels of his sports cars. He played tuba and football at Vicksburg High School and loved auto racing, being a member of The Sports Car Club of America (SCCA). He studied at the Chicago Art Institute, loved to paint and listen to blues music. He spent his 75th birthday with family enjoying the music of one of his favorite blues artists, Buddy Guy, on the shores of Lake Michigan. He loved his family and friends, and the grace, determination and strength with which he fought a lengthy battle with multiple system atrophy, showed everyone how to value every moment they are given. “Bob and I were married in 1960 and blessed with two children (Lisa and Bruce) within 2 years of our marriage. Everything written in this memory of his life that I've read on this obituary reminds me of just how much he enjoyed and lived his life in his unique and very independent way. Bob also graduated from the Laguna Beach Art Institute in Laguna Beach, CA where he and his companion (Hope) spent happy years together - both with many common interests and both enjoying the excitement of traveling and taking part in the auto-racing/sports-car racing groups that were in abundance in CA. Even Bob and I enjoyed our music together; me as his accompanist on the piano - or listening to classical music if we'd just wound down from a day at South Haven in Michigan - hill-climbing with his close friends, or a motorcycle drag-race in Osceola, Indiana. When Bob moved from California in 1977 he met up with another man named Bob who owned a small machine shop. Together they were the first to design and hold a patent on manufacturing lens that were made of plastic and much less expensive than glass used for optical lens. In doing so, this made a great contribution to the industry - today we can buy those low-cost reading glasses for a few dollars without prescription costs, etc. We owe that 'thank you' to Bob Hinkley and Bob Campbell. Bob Hinkley was also the lead mold-maker on those wonderful Lego 'building blocks' we all see (or step on) and marvel at their quality and how do they manufacture these tiny little items - over and over; into the billions that exist today. Again, we can thank Bob Hinkley for that because after other molds were broken and cast away, Bob's designs were still working beautifully. I once held the award Bob got for that particular design and read the letter of thank you for his contribution. Space doesn't allow for all the accolades about Bob - simply said, he was a quiet genius and we love him! Diane (Hinkley) Stevens.”
