You could feel the love, I said to my Rod, “oh how sweet, he calls your mom angel,” Rod said back to me, “no, it’s Injun” to this day I am still not sure if it was based on a car engine, or like the Chief Injun, anyway it was sweet, I have only witnessed him get angry one time, but his little QUEEN could push his buttons like no one else, I think if he had it his way Julie would still be “cutting out paper dolls”.

I watched a man endure things in life that would do most of us in, but I truly believe his biggest fight was with alcohol, which he was victorious, he did not hide the fact that w/o AA and his faith, it may not have happened.

During one of his many surgeries Little and Big Rod were in the hospital on the same day, Big Rod was having his lung removed Little Rod was having his pericardium (lining around his heart) removed, both major surgeries. When my sisters came to visit the next day, the very next day, they had no problem finding Little Rods room, they followed the little man in the hospital gown with a sweater, but no underwear running to Little Rods room. The love that Big Rod expressed was so apparent when not even 30 days after having his lung removed, when all hell broke loose, thought we were going to lose Little Rod there for a second, Big Rod appeared at the emergency room what seemed like seconds. (Thanks Tony). After his lung was removed there were too many times that Big Rod could have thrown in the towel or at least screamed and complained, he didn’t, I never heard him complain, ever. His absence will be felt by those who knew him but Rod was fond of saying “pay it forward” (before it became popular), I can assure all of you that he paid it forward. Rod, Tony and Julie I know how much you are going to miss your dad, but I hope it brings you comfort knowing that you are him living; exemplified. Your dad was so proud of each of you, and I know that he is up there telling everyone what an amazing job you did taking care of him!

To each of you I say when you start to miss Rod the best thing you can do is give of your time or talents, that is what he lived for.
