She served congregations with her Pastor husband in Baileyville and Fulton Illinois, Bradenton, Florida, Grand Rapids, Michigan and Vernon Hills, Illinois. Lastly they moved to South Holland, Illinois where Ray accepted a position of Synod Minister for the Synod of Mid-America. They retired in 1993 and enjoyed time together at their summer home on Lincoln Lake and settled in Zeeland in 1998. Ruth had been active in "Reformed Church Women" for more than 50 years. She served as a Women-in-Leadership facilitator and was speaker and Bible Study leader at numerous retreats. She also served on the Board of North American Missions. She volunteered her services to numerous hospitals in the Chicagoland area. She enjoyed reading and traveling. Ruth was preceded in death by her husband of 53 years. She is survived by two sons, Ron (Sara) Rewerts of West Bend, Wisconsin and Phil (Deb) Rewerts of Grand Rapids, Michigan; two grandchildren (Alisha and Paul), and 2 great grandchildren: brother Roger Jipping and Sister Lois (Don) Schreur of Holland Michigan; nieces and nephews.
