Simon Disselkoen, 95, of Zeeland, passed away on September 28, 2016. Simon was born in Corsica, South Dakota, July 31, 1921, to Anthony and Anna (Hansum) Disselkoen. He served his country in the U.S. Army during WWII from 1942-1945 in the Pacific Theater. Simon was a decorated disabled veteran, receiving a bronze star medal and a purple heart. Simon married Margaret Krommendyk in 1943. Simon spent his work life as a contractor. Margaret and Simon raised their family in Zeeland and were longtime members of Third CRC of Zeeland.
