Terry Lee Agal, 69, was born in Beech Grove, Indiana on February 5, 1946 to parents John and Jane Agal. He graduated from Kokomo High School in Kokomo, Indiana in 1964. He went on to earn a degree in chemical engineering in 1968 from what is now Rose Hulman, Terre Haute, Indiana. Employment included Mead Johnson, Youth For Christ, Hart & Cooley, Clarion, and Maranatha Bible and Missionary Conference of Norton Shores, MI. In retirement he drove a school bus for various school districts. Terry became a Christian at the age of 10 at a youth camp and this relationship became the foundation of who he was as a man. Best known for his servant-leadership style, his first love was his family. Surviving are his wife Kay of Holland, MI, and daughters, Betsy Agal of Holland, MI and Kimberly Agal of Colorado Springs, CO. Also surviving are brothers Rev. Steven R. (Janet) Agal of Mooresville, Indiana and Jeff (Anna) Agal of Greencastle, Indiana. Preceding him in death was a sister, Martha (Agal) Kalmbacher of South Byron, New York. A private interment has been planned by the family. A memorial service will be held Sunday, November 15 at 2:00 pm in the Michigan room at Maranatha Bible and Missionary Conference, Norton Shores, MI.
